

What We Learned From Lab 2

- it seems that we should make comma delimited data sets in `.txt` or use tab delimited or space delimited, or even just doing them in EXCEL, rather than get EXCEL involved in doing `.csv` things, since we sometimes have trouble getting StatCrunch or R to recognize the EXCEL generated files when done in `.csv`
- StatCrunch does not do such a quick job on segmented bar graphs, used for independence considerations of categorical variables studies. One has to sort of manipulate the data to get the box plots to print correctly.
- When copying tables from StatCrunch to WORD, realize that the tables are imported as tables into WORD, rather than as graphics, so sometimes it is a bit tricky to change sizes on the page to fit correctly on WORD.
- Since all of your homework is done online in STAT 451, it is, I think, important to do a few end of chapter odd-numbered problems “by hand” so you round out your understanding of the various statistical concepts.
